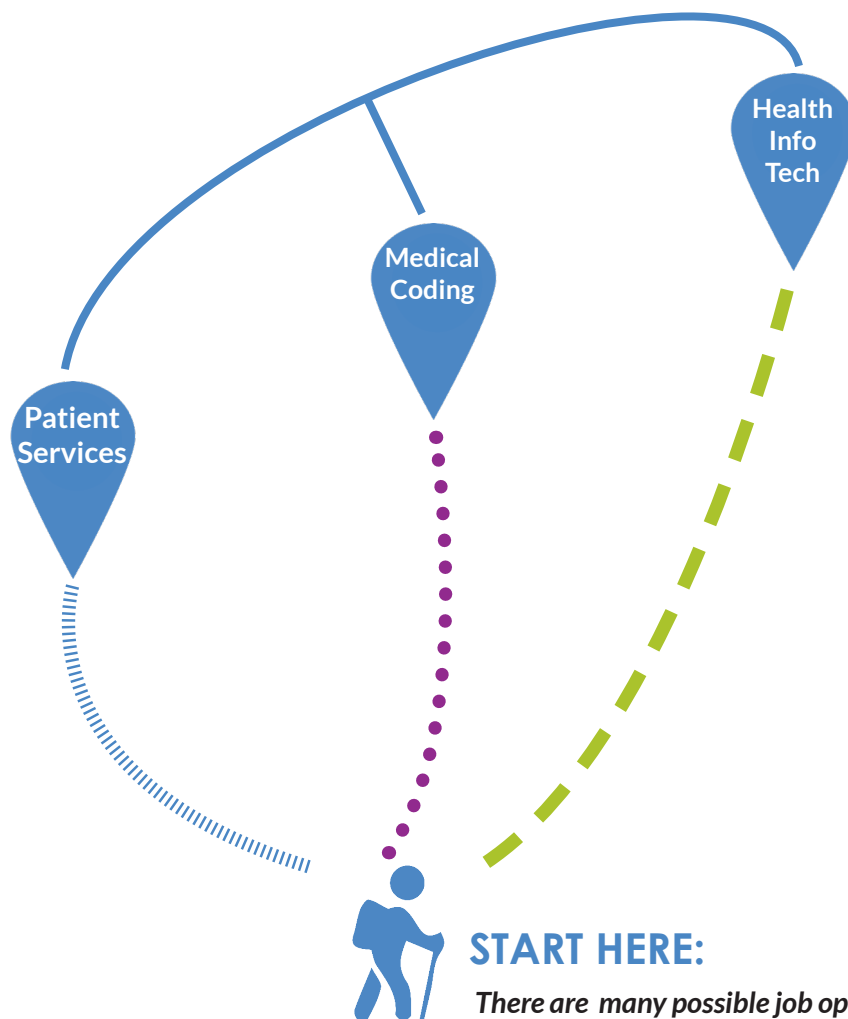

START HERE:

There are many possible job opportunities in this pathway!

You can start at any place along the path as long as you have the experience or education needed for the role. You can also move up the path from one job to another once you have completed the right level of education.

For example, you could work as a Receptionist, take the Medical Coding course and earn your certificate to become a Medical Coder; or you could enroll directly into a Health Information Management degree program to become a Health Information Technician.

PATIENT SERVICES REPRESENTATIVE

This job is also sometimes called *Receptionist*

Job Description

Front-desk customer service in hospital or medical office. Greets and directs patients, gathers paperwork from new patients, answers phone, schedules appointments, enters health information into electronic system, collects payments, maintains patient charts in a filing system



Work Settings

Hospitals, medical offices



Perks

No experience required, pay is generally above minimum wage, jobs are often full time with regular hours (for example, 8am-5pm Monday through Friday)



Hours

Full time, part time jobs, often Monday - Friday 8am-5pm



Starting Pay

Starting wage estimate: \$11 per hour (\$22,880 yearly)



Requirements

High School Diploma or Equivalency



Education

No additional degrees or certificates necessary after High School or Equivalency completion



Where to go in Western Maine

There are a number of larger health care facilities in Western Maine. Here are just a few that might have job openings for this role: Franklin Memorial Hospital, Western Maine Health, Franklin Community Health Network, Stephens Memorial Hospital, Western Maine Mountain Clinic













Other things to consider...

It is helpful to have an understanding of Medical Terminology (many job descriptions say that this is "preferred"). You can learn online for free -- there are many videos on YouTube and websites available.

MEDICAL CODING

Job Description

Answering phone calls, scheduling, calling insurance companies, entering codes into the system accurately to bill for services, processing claims, maintaining patient accounts, audits records for completeness and accuracy

	Work Settings	Hospitals, Clinics, Physician practices, Surgery centers, Long-term care facilities, Home health agencies
	Perks	Learn valuable skills on the job, good pay, variable hours, opportunity for advancement, benefits for full time employees
	Hours	Full time, part time jobs, often Monday - Friday 8am-5pm
	Starting Pay	Starting wage estimate: \$15 per hour (\$31,200 yearly)
	Requirements	High School Diploma or Equivalency Coding Certificate (CPC - Certified Professional Coder or CCS - Certified Coding Specialist)
	Education	Coursework in anatomy & physiology, pathophysiology, pharmacology, medical terminology, reimbursement methodology, intermediate/advanced ICD diagnostic/procedural and CPT coding
	Where to go in Western Maine	Central Maine Community College (CMCC) - you can earn either a Certificate (32-33 credit hours) or an Associate's Degree (see following page) Kennebec Valley Community College (KVCC) offers a 4 semester Certificate Program for people currently working in the health care field (34 credits) CPC exams are offered frequently in Bangor, Portland, and Lewiston CCS exams are offered at Pearson locations in Bangor and Westbrook
	Length of Program	2 semesters full time Exam takes 5 hours and 40 minutes (150 multiple choice questions)
	Cost of Program	CMCC Certificate \$3,490 for in state tuition KVCC Certificate (34 credits) \$3,196 for in state tuition You will need to purchase books and other supplies (\$1,200) and pay additional school fees (for enrollment, parking, etc. may be up to \$500 total) To become a CPC you must take an exam through the AAPC after completing your Certificate program \$380 To become a CCS you must take an exam through AHIMA \$399
	Other things to consider...	Other professional certifications similar to the CPC or CSS are CCA (Certified Coding Associate), RHIA (Registered Health Information Administrator)

HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNICIAN

Job Description

Compile, maintain, and process medical records of patients consistent with requirements of the health care system. Compile, process, maintain, and report patient information for health requirements and standards consistent with the healthcare industry's numerical coding system



Work Settings

Hospital, Home Health Care Agencies, Law Firms, Clinics, Mental Health Facilities, Physicians' Offices, Nursing Homes Health Maintenance Organizations, Software Companies, Consulting Firms, Private Insurance Companies



Perks

Learn valuable skills on the job, good pay, variable hours, opportunity for advancement, benefits for full time employees



Hours

Full time, part time jobs, often Monday - Friday 8am-5pm



Starting Pay

Starting wage estimate: \$17.32 per hour (\$35,840 yearly)



Requirements

High School Diploma or Equivalency
Associate's Degree
Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT) credential



Education

Associate's Degree

RHIT exams are offered at Pearson locations in Bangor and Westbrook



Length of Program

CMCC: 2 years (4 semesters full time) 62-63 credits (available online)
KVCC: 2 years (4 semesters full time) 68 credits



Cost of Program

CMCC: \$5,796 for in state tuition (\$92 per credit hour)
KVCC: \$6,256 for in state tuition (\$92 per credit hour)
You will need to purchase books and other supplies (\$1,200) and pay additional school fees (for enrollment, parking, etc. may be up to \$500 total)
[RHIT](#) exam through AHIMA \$299



Other things to consider...

Following the completion of either of these programs, you may become certified as a CPC, CSS, CCA, RHIA (similar to Certificate program) or you may sit for your Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT) exam
