Maine Medical Center/ University of Southern Maine Accelerated BSN Program Paula T. White MS RN Maine Medical Center

Since 2009, Maine Medical Center Department of Nursing (MMC) and the University of Southern Maine School of Nursing (USM) have collaborated in the development of a pilot project to;

- 1) Increase capacity in the undergraduate nursing program,
- 2) Support the acquisition and development of clinical faculty, and
- 3) Strengthen the link between clinical and classroom teaching.

MMC is looking to ensure a workforce sufficient in both quantity and competence to meet the demands of a complex and increasingly technologic workplace. USM is looking to create a sustainable educational model which ensures quality of educational outcomes and has the potential to build a next generation of nurse educators. USM and MMC are also looking to develop a strong and ongoing partnership to provide opportunities for future endeavors, research, and scholarship.

The Pilot Design incorporates:

- Admission of 24 additional students into an Accelerated BSN Program in January of 2011 through May of 2012.
- Creation of a new Maine Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) prerequisite.
- A dedicated 200 hour Maine Medical Center CNA Course provided in the fall of 2010 at no cost to students.
- Creation of teaching teams comprised of academic faculty and practice based clinical experts supported by MMC.
- Redesign of the curriculum by academic and practice partners to build upon the CNA prerequisite with stronger integration of classroom, simulation, and clinical immersion experiences.
- > Development of clinical experts as faculty.
- > Research design.
- Ongoing assessments and supports.

Anticipated outcomes/benefits

This initiative is based upon a multi-year commitment which expands beyond year one. Faculty needs to support the teaching teams will progressively increase over successive semesters to provide for the increasing student capacity through 2013.
